

About KHC Consolidated Measurement Reports



The Kentuckiana Health Collaborative (KHC) is a non-profit coalition of members representing providers, payers, purchasers, and consumers that distributes annual consolidated measurement reports to physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants in Kentucky and Southern Indiana. Data supplied in these reports allows for comparison to local and state average and benchmark scores on the quality of care patients received on a variety of ambulatory care indicators. Each year, health plans supply administrative data from their annual National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set (HEDIS®) submissions to the KHC for aggregation.

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Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Kentuckiana Health Collaborative (KHC)?

The Kentuckiana Health Collaborative (KHC) is a non-profit organization comprised of representatives who have a major stake in improving the health status and the healthcare delivery system in Greater Louisville. This includes people and organizations who provide care (providers include hospitals and doctors), people who pay the providers (such as insurance companies), people who pay for benefits/coverage (such as employers), and many others. The KHC creates a space for these stakeholders to work together toward the common goal of improving community health by using the Triple Aim goals of Better Health, Better Care, and Better Value.

Where does the data for this report come from?

The information displayed on this report comes from our health plan partners - Aetna Better Health of Kentucky, Anthem Blue Cross Blue Shield, Humana Health Plan of Kentucky, and WellCare Health Plan of Kentucky. The data includes only claims data. No chart reviews were conducted.

Will my information be shared publicly?

No, individual provider data is not shared publicly. Group practice data is available publicly for groups that do NOT opt out of sharing their data with the public. If you belong to a practice with three or more qualifying providers in the Greater Louisville area, your scores will be aggregated with the other providers in your group practice. More than 95% of group practices share their data publicly on www.GoHealthShare.com.

How can I use this report?

As healthcare providers are increasingly being reimbursed for quality indicators and their patients' outcomes, healthcare quality data becomes increasingly important to understand and to have. This report has been designed to help give you feedback on prioritized quality measures, as another resource to help indicate gap areas in your performance.

Who gets these reports?

Primary care and women's healthcare providers who have patients with one of our health plan partners receive these reports. This includes physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants. Providers must have a minimum of five patients for a measure to receive their score for that measure.

Who are my patients? Can I see a list?

Your patients include members for whom you provided the most preventive care or outpatient services in 2017. Unfortunately, we do not have a list of patients attributed to each provider, but each of your data points come directly from the plans' HEDIS performance reporting. We encourage you to use both your internal data and the KHC data during your quality improvement efforts.

How were these measures selected?

The measures were selected by a team of professionals from health plans, health systems, government organizations, and employers. Many of them are providers like you.
