

Michael Hagen, MD

Professor, Department of Family and Community Medicine | University of Kentucky

Dr. Hagen completed medical school and family medicine residency training at the University of Missouri-Columbia. Following residency, he practiced for several years in the Missouri Ozarks before joining the faculty at the University of Kentucky (UK) Department of Family and Community Medicine in 1981. At UK he has served as Residency Director, Clinic Director, Clerkship Director, Research Director, Associate Chair, and Chair. He took a leave of absence to complete a National Library of Medicine fellowship in Medical Informatics at New England Medical Center from 1987-1989. Dr. Hagen served a five-year term on the American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) from 1991-1996, serving as President in his final year on the Board. He has led the ABFM's clinical simulation project since 1996, first as a part-time appointment and then full-time since 1998.

Dr. Hagen retired recently as ABFM Senior Vice President where he had primary responsibility for ABFM's continuing certification activities. He teaches part-time at the University of Kentucky, where he holds the rank of Professor in the Department of Family and Community Medicine. He remains a Diplomate of the American Board of Family Medicine and a Clinical Informatics Diplomate of the American Board of Preventive Medicine and participates actively in ABFM's and ABPM's continuing certification processes. He is married with two daughters and has been licensed as a ham radio operator for over 55 years.
